

This year marked a historic milestone for RVG with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Motilal Oswal Foundation, an important leap towards realising our long-standing vision of expanding student infrastructure. In a single, unprecedented act of generosity, the Foundation disbursed a grant of ₹100 Crores (RVG's largest-ever) to support the development of a new, world-class hostel facility in Marol, Andheri East, Mumbai.

Named the 'Agrawal Oswal Chhatrawas', the upcoming campus will span over 4 lakh sq. ft. and house approx 2,000 CA students, equipped with modern amenities that foster academic rigour, personal growth, and a vibrant residential community. We are profoundly grateful to Shri Raamdeo Agrawal ji, Shri Motilal Oswal ji, and their families for their visionary support, which reaffirms our mission to nurture India's future Chartered Accountants with excellence and integrity.






Raising the Bar Higher

After providing depreciation of ₹460.93 Lakhs and earmarking of ₹635.50 Lakhs for various funds, the foundation has recorded a surplus of ₹173.50 Lakhs.

The management has consistently strived to keep costs minimal without compromising the quality of services offered to students. Staying true to its core objective of serving society, RVG remains committed to providing quality facilities at affordable rates, ensuring that students from modest backgrounds can access and benefit from its offerings.

Key Highlights

1) RVG Re-construction Fund

Considering the life of the Hostel Campus across locations, RVG has established a dedicated fund for reconstruction of any of its hostel campuses. This fund, built over the years, currently stands at ₹325 Lakhs.

2) RVG Scholarship Fund

The RVG Scholarship Fund was established through generous contributions from various donors with the objective of supporting deserving students through financial assistance. The current size of the fund stands at ₹215.89 Lakhs.

In addition to this, RVG receives annual contributions of:

- ₹6.25 Lakhs from the Motilal Oswal Foundation, and;
- A committed ₹7.20 Lakhs per year from Sunil Patodia Welfare Foundation, starting from the Financial year 2024–2025.

To extend the impact of this initiative and reach more students in need, we invite donors to support this noble cause through the following options:

• Sponsor one student for a year: ₹72,000



- Sponsor multiple students in a year: Multiples of ₹72.000
- Sponsor one student for multiple years: Multiples of ₹72,000

RVG provides a monthly financial assistance of ₹6,000 to deserving students from modest family backgrounds who receive limited stipend income. This support is intended to ease their financial burden and help them focus on their academic goals.

In recognition of academic excellence, RVG also offers a Merit Scholarship of ₹2,000 per month to students who have secured an All India Rank in the IPCC exam and are admitted to the RVG Hostel.

We maintain a robust and transparent selection process to ensure that all scholarships are awarded to genuinely deserving candidates, following strict verification protocols.

Donations are eligible for tax benefits under Section 80G of the Income Tax Act, 1961, and can also qualify under CSR provisions based on donor preferences.

3) RVG Medical Assistance Fund

In line with its commitment to the well-being of its community, RVG has established a Medical Assistance Fund to provide timely financial support to students and staff members in need of medical treatment. The current corpus of the fund stands at ₹34.30 Lakhs.

This fund is designed to ensure that medical care remains accessible and affordable, especially during times of health emergencies, helping to alleviate financial stress during critical moments.

Disbursements from the fund are made following a careful assessment of several key factors, including:

- · Nature and urgency of the medical condition
- · Family background and financial circumstances
- · Required amount of assistance
- · Type and cost of treatment
- · Other relevant considerations

All fund allocations are subject to the approval of the Managing Committee and the Board of Trustees, ensuring responsible, transparent, and fair utilisation of resources.

4) Infrastructural Upgrade

Proposed New Hostel - Agrawal Oswal Chhatrawas, Marol , Andheri East

Motilal Oswal Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd., has disbursed ₹100 Crore to RVG Educational Foundation for the 'Agrawal Oswal Chhatrawas', a landmark residential and educational hostel campus for outstation Chartered Accountant (CA) aspirants in Mumbai. This is in addition to the 1st "Agrawal Oswal Chhatrawa" in Andheri West built over a decade ago.

Located in Marol, Andheri East, Mumbai, this campus will comprise two 17-storey towers spread across 4,00,000 sq.ft. with state-of-the-art amenities including a library, mess, fitness zones, wellness spaces, and more, setting a new benchmark in student living and learning. Once constructed, the "Agrawal Oswal Chhatrawas" could potentially become India's largest residential CA hostel and provide a home away from home to over 2,000+ deserving CA aspirants.

This collaboration holds deep personal meaning for both Shri Motilal Oswal and Shri Raamdeo Agrawal, who began their professional journeys at an RVG hostel in Mumbai during the early 1980s. This initiative is their way of giving back to the very place that gave them their start.

5) Air-conditioning of rooms at Madanlal Rajpuria Vidyarthi Griha (MRVG)

As part of our commitment to providing exceptional services to students, we recently undertook a major renovation and refurbishment project at MRVG. The ground floor and all rooms were revamped and inaugurated on May 19, 2024.

To further enhance student comfort, we installed VRV air conditioning units in all 88 rooms, completing the project within a span of just 3 months. These upgrades reflect our dedication to creating a conducive and comfortable environment for our students.

6) Refurbishment and Renovation of Agrawal Oswal Chhatrawas (AOC)

The rooms on the 1st to 5th floors of the AOC campus underwent a comprehensive renovation and refurbishment which includes:

- a. Addition of completely new furniture in rooms.
- b. Addition of beds to each room, increasing capacity by 70 seats.

 Installation of VRV air conditioning units, making all rooms air-conditioned.

The project was completed within a span of 6 months and the rooms were allotted to students from October 2024. With its completion, the AOC campus now has a total capacity to accommodate 520 students.

7) Expansion of Premlata Ramesh Chandra Sharma RVG Girls Hostel, Versova:

Inaugurated in July 2023, the Premlata Ramesh Chandra Sharma RVG Girls Hostel in Versova currently accommodates 152 students within its seven-storey facility. In response to increasing demand, an expansion project is underway to add additional floors to the existing structure.

Once completed, the hostel will have the capacity to house approximately 225 students, significantly enhancing our ability to support aspiring young girls in their academic journey. The project is expected to be completed by March 2026.

8) Proposed redevelopment of Vijay Shrigopal Khetan Girls Hostel, Goregaon (VSKGH): Established in 2013 with a capacity to accommodate 140 students, VSKGH is now poised for a significant transformation. To create a more modern, student-friendly environment, we are undertaking a comprehensive redevelopment of the hostel property.

The upgraded facility will feature state-of-the-art infrastructure and best-in-class services, aligning

with our commitment to providing a high-quality living experience. This initiative is aimed at ensuring that VSKGH continues to meet the evolving needs of students while offering a comfortable, secure, and supportive atmosphere for academic and personal growth.

9) Status of land acquired at Kandivali for hostel: In 2019, RVG initiated a project to acquire a 2,400 sq. metre plot in Kandivali West, entering into a formal Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the vendor trust. Despite our best efforts, the project has faced unforeseen challenges, as the vendor trust unilaterally withdrew from the agreement, effectively cancelling the transaction.

To safeguard RVG's interests and pursue the rightful acquisition of the land, we have initiated legal proceedings and remain hopeful that the matter will be resolved amicably and in RVG's favour, in alignment with the principles of fairness and justice.

Sanjeevani Mamta Hospital & Research Centre: RVG students receive free comprehensive health checkups, with access to OPD and other medical services offered at subsidised rates. Additionally, RVG staff and their families are eligible to benefit from these services.

These collaborations underscore RVG's commitment to providing accessible and affordable healthcare to its entire community.

14) ISO Certification: The Trust has been awarded the ISO 9001:2015 certification in October 2024. This certification demonstrates the Trust's commitment to maintaining a quality management system.

NOTE "1" NOTES & SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Organisation Overview

RVG Educational Foundation ('the Society/ trust or RVGEF') is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 as well as Maharashtra Public Trust Act, 1950 as a democratic body with Non-profit motives. RVGEF is also a registered Public Charitable Trust. It has been granted registration No. BOM 67 of 1960 (GBBSD) on 16/08/1960 under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. It has also been granted registration No. F-844(Bombay) on 07/02/1961 by the Charity Commissioner, Mumbai under the provisions of the Maharashtra Public Trusts Act, 1950. Trust has been granted registration u/s 12AA and 80G of Income Tax Act 1961. It is also registered for CSR activities and under FCRA Act, 2010.

Principle activity of the Trust is to provide a complete educational eco-system to the students pursuing higher education in Mumbai. This Institution through its institutional facilities in Mumbai is helping the youth pursuing the course of Chartered Accountancy at Mumbai to become a chartered accountant.

The Trust has been awarded the ISO 9001:2015 certification in October 2024, which is valid until October 2027. This certification demonstrates the Trust's commitment to maintaining a quality management system.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statements

The balance sheet and income and expenditure accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and on the accrual basis of accounting. These statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies as described below.

2.2 Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires that the Trustees of the Trust ('Trustee') make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of income and expenditure of the year and reported balance of assets and liabilities. Management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised prospectively in current and future periods. All amounts are stated in Indian rupees.

2.3 Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Fixed Assets are capitalised at cost of acquisition. Cost includes cost incurred to bring the assets to their present location and condition.

Depreciation on fixed assets has been provided for on straight line value method (SLM) at the rates considering the balance useful life of the assets worked out and minuted by Executive Committee.

From Financial Year 2014-15, depreciation is being provided on Straight Line Method (SLM). Opening Balance under Gross Block is aggregate amount of Opening Written down Value (WDV) as at 01/04/2014 and additions made at cost thereafter.

Land is not depreciated. Depreciation is charged at half the normal rate in case of assets put to use for less than 180 days during the year.

Intangible Assets are capitalized at cost of development / acquisition. Intangible Assets are amortised on straight line value method at the rates considering the balance useful life worked out and minuted by Executive Committee.

2.4 Investments

Investments are stated at cost.

2.5 Revenue Recognition

Term Fees from Students have been accounted as income on accrual basis.

Donation received in cash or in kind is recognized as income when the donation is received.

Donations made with a specific direction that they shall form part of the corpus fund of the Trust are classified as corpus donations, and are directly reflected as trust fund receipts in the balance sheet.

Income from Service charges for use of Trust Properties for various events is recognized on time proportion basis.

Donations received with the specific direction regarding use of donation are transferred to specific earmarked funds through Income and Expenditure Account. Once utilisation of these funds are completed same are transferred to Non Earmarked Utilised Funds.



NOTE "1" NOTES & SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.6 Other Income

Interest on deployment of funds is recognized using the time-proportion method, based on underlying interest rates.

Interest on Income on Income tax refund is recognized in the year of receipt.

2.7 Employee Benefits

Employee benefits payable wholly within twelve months of rendering the services are classified as short term employee benefits and are recognized in the period in which the employee renders the related service. Trust has taken Group Gratuity Scheme from Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC). Contribution paid to LIC is accounted as expenditure in year of payment.

2.8 Resources Expensed

All expenditure are accounted on accrual basis of accounting and has been classified under the heading that aggregates all costs relating to that category.

2.9 Taxes on Income

No provision for Income tax has been made as the Institution is registered under Section 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 ('the Act'). Under the provisions of the Act, the income of the Trust is exempted from tax, subject to the compliance of terms and conditions specified in the Act.

2.10 Provision and Contingent Liabilities

Provisions are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible or present obligation that may, but probably will not require an outflow of resources. When there is a possible obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

Accounting policies not specifically referred to otherwise are consistent with the generally accepted accounting practices.

2.11 Accounting of Subsidy Receipts

Subsidy received is accounted for on cash basis and considered as Income in the year of receipt of subsidy.

3. The trust has negotiated a transaction of acquisition of piece of land during financial year 2019-20 in Kandivali West for the purpose of furthering its objectives. Advances paid and expense incurred in this context of ₹2,21,25,694/- are shown as 'Advances against Kandivali project'. The process of land acquisition is yet to be completed and matter is in litigation. Vendor has unilaterally cancelled the deal. Trust has pursued the matter by filing Caveat with Charity Commissioner and an arbitration petition before Hon'ble Bombay High Court seeking for specific performance and has requested the High Court for direction for Arbitration proceedings.

4. Contingent Liability

I. There is no contingent liability at the end of the year except Income tax demand of ₹74,94,414/-in respect of Assessment Year 2017-18. A sum of ₹20,83,106/- paid/adjusted against the aforesaid demand is shown under current assets as Refunds Receivable. Necessary application for rectification and appeal with CIT(A) are filed and same are pending for disposal. Management is confident that on disposal of our appeal demands would be quashed as same are not based on facts and therefore no provision is required to be charged on this account to Income and Expenditure account.

 - i. Marol, Andheri East, Mumbai Project: Estimated amount of contract remaining to be executed on capital account and not provided for (net of advances of ₹51,51,000) relating to said project is ₹1,06,48,49,000/- (One Hundred Six Crores and Forty Eight Lakhs Forty Nine Thousand Only).
- ii. Kandivali East, Mumbai Project: Estimated amount of contract remaining to be executed on capital account and not provided for (net of advances of ₹2,00,00,000) relating to said project is ₹22,00,00,000/-. (Twenty Two Crores Only).
